M1 Garand Clinic



Stop looking at that M1 Garand you bought and learn how to shoot it!

Crosse Creek Rifle and Pistol Club will be conducting an M1 Garand Clinic on 18 April 2026 at the CCRPC Range with Check in at 08:30

Competition open to: 12 eligible competitors. Need not be a member. Competitors must have a notarized CMP "Eligibility Affidavit and Liability Agreement" already on file at CCRPC or present one at registration (forms are also available at <https://thecmp.org/competitions/forms/>). Persons under the age of 18 must be accompanied by a parent or guardian and have a signed CMP Parent Consent Form.

Entry Fee: \$30.00 Entry fee. M1 Garand safe ammunition will be available at \$1.00 per round. Limited number of M1 GI cotton web slings will be available at \$15.00 each. Enbloc clips will be available, but shooters are encouraged to bring what they have. No reloaded ammunition is allowed.

Entries Close: NLT 10 April 2026

Firing Starts: The Range will be open at 08:30. Firearms safety checks and sign in will commence at that time. Instruction begins at 0930. Once instruction begins, no additional participants will be permitted. All rifles must be cased until instructed otherwise.

Supervision: The clinic will be supervised by certified CMP Master Instructors. All shooters will receive hands-on training for the proper loading and firing of the M1 Garand prior to live fire. Experienced competitive shooters will assist with all aspects of the clinic and provide competitive shooting instruction. At the conclusion of the clinic, participants will have received the instruction needed to safely and effectively participate in CMP rifle competitions.

Course of Fire: Shooters will demonstrate a good zero from the 25-yard line. Familiarization will include prone dry fire, followed by 5 rounds to confirm a 200 yard zero. This will be followed by a practice prone rapid fire of prone from standing (or prone only if unable) and then a dry fire coached standing offhand position. Following the zeroing and familiarization firing, a complete 30 round CMP Garand match will be conducted. Approximately 52 total rounds will be required. CMP award pins may be presented based on match scores.

ADDITIONAL INSTRUCTIONS ON BACK

Additional Instructions.

-All shooters are expected to bring an M1 Garand Rifle in good, safe operating condition. Rifles must be cased until instructed otherwise. Upon registration all rifles will be inspected and triggers weighed.

-BEFORE arriving at the range, rifles must be checked to be clear of ammunition and either cased or have a safety flag inserted. No rifles may be removed from vehicles until directed to do so.

-Safe for M1 ammunition will be available on the range for \$1.00 a round (minimum of 52 rds. will be needed.). Commercial hunting .30 is not safe for firing in the M1. No reloaded ammunition will be allowed due to possible hazard to self and other participants. Please bring M1 enbloc clips if you have them, however they will be available if you do not.

-All shooters will bring eye protection and hearing protection.

-Shooters should have a GI M1 cotton web sling or a M1907 leather sling. A limited number of GI cotton web slings will be available at \$15.00

-Glove. Competition gloves are encouraged but not critical. A good work glove for the non-firing hand will suffice.

-Ground cloth or pad (tarp, closed cell sleeping bag mat, piece of carpet will do) or shooting mat.

-Clothing: Sweatshirt, long pants, cap, outdoor shoes or boots. Purpose designed shooting jackets are authorized per CMP rules.

-Other: Pen, sunscreen, insect repellent, water (please stay hydrated). Please bring a spotting scope capable of spotting .30 holes at 200 yards- with stand if possible. Coaches may assist with their scopes if needed. Blank score cards and copies of data cards will be provided.

LUNCH/FOOD/DRINKS/WATER: Must bring your own. STAY HYDRATED!! We will break between the 25 yard zero and taking up positions at the 200 yard line.
